

Admissions requirements

AGE

Applicant must be 21 years of age or older.

EDUCATION

A high school diploma or G.E.D. is not required (but applicant must furnish a copy of high school diploma or G.E.D. certificate, if applicable, at the time of enrollment). If applicant does not have a high school diploma or G.E.D., an assessment test will be given to determine that the student has the ability to benefit from the training offered.

ASSESSMENT TEST

Each student who does not have a copy of his/her high school diploma or G.E.D. certificate will be given the Wonderlic ATB test during the first week of school. This test assesses the students ability to read, write and understand the English language, as well as some basic mathematics.

MEDICAL REQUIREMENTS

Each applicant must pass the Department Of Transportation examination, including but not limited to urinalysis drug screening, and Breath Alcohol Test.

REGISTRATION PROCEDURES

Applicants must make an appointment for information about admission requirements prior to course registration. Call 1-800-TRUCKING for an appointment time.

FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE

If you qualify for financial assistance, all documentation must be completed, approved, and submitted to the Admissions offfice prior to the beginning of class.
